- 2. To begin understanding and annotations
- 3. To check understanding and complete annotations
- Notice things like rhyme/other sound techniques, punctuation, capitalization, and word choice
- Look up words you don't know (both in the question and in the passage)
 - DO NOT give up! KEEP TRYING!!

NON-FICTION



- Notice the structure

- Think DEEPLY with this type of text. Students typically feel most comfortable with narratives, but constantly miss questions about them because they RUSH through.



 - 5. Select answer ONLY after consulting the text


